Our Professional Growth. As a professional association, the Association can and should provide us with the opportunities to build our practices, to learn and network with each other, and to gain useful leadership and other opportunities. As Chair of the Business Law Section, I accomplished this through connections and partnerships between lawyers, judges, and the business community as well as collaboration amongst the many incredible nonprofit and affinity bar associations throughout the Philadelphia area. I am committed to promoting cross-mentorship and networking between members and other organizations.

Access to Justice, Fairness, and the Rule of Law. The Association has a long history of advocating for its members and those in our community who may not be able to advocate for themselves. We should continue to promote integrity in the profession by championing causes such as fair elections and the protection of the judiciary and judges, and by fighting against hate and poverty through the rule of law and the right to counsel. As I have done as Co-Chair of the Women's Rights Committee as well as through other roles, I am committed to being the voice that stands for defending the rule of law wherever and whenever we can.

Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Justice. Diversity, equity, inclusion, and justice have garnered a front and center focus for all organizations. As the child of Middle Eastern immigrants, I have always hoped for this momentum to celebrate and foster belonging. As a child, I knew early on that life would not be easy with a name like "Katayun" and beloved parents who spoke broken English. As a woman in the law and business, I experienced too often the feeling of being underrepresented and the only female voice at the table. Having stood on the shoulders of many before me who saw in me what others would not, my life's mission has been to lift up, mentor, sponsor, and empower others. I have and will continue to promote and support all forms of diversity, including race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, disability, and age, at all levels of our profession from the law student to the associate, the partner, the in-house counsel, the bench, and beyond.

Legal Services Organizations. Legal services organizations are the cornerstone of justice and they should always be a priority supported financially and through volunteerism. Only with the full support from the Association can we champion justice, the rule of law, and community service. From Family Court in Philadelphia representing abused and neglected children to the detention centers in Folsom, Georgia representing detained immigrants, I have worked hand-in-hand with many and have seen firsthand the important and great work of these legal services organizations.

Lawyer Health and Well-Being. Well-being and self-care are critical components for our profession and we as a society can support others to grow and heal as necessary. I am passionate about helping lawyers optimize their well-being. I built the Mindfulness Series of the Business Law Section with fellow colleagues and advocated for the launch of the Wellness Committee at the Association years before wellness was discussed in the profession, which resulted in the Chancellor creating the Wellness Committee.

After receiving my JD from George Washington School of Law and completing a federal clerkship at the Court of Federal Claims, I returned to Philadelphia to build my practice. I currently Chair the Corporate Governance and Securities group at Cozen O'Connor and was named to *The Philadelphia Business Journal's* "Best of the Bar 2020" in recognition of my leadership skills and corporate accomplishments.

My parents instilled in me both a strong work ethic and a commitment to service. In addition to my robust legal practice, I have served on many boards of directors; volunteered in many programs throughout Philadelphia; served in leadership roles in both the Philadelphia Bar Association and the American Bar Association; and served countless organizations on a pro bono basis. My largest *pro bono* commitment has been to the Support Center for Child Advocates, where I served as a child advocate and on the board culminating in Board President, and serve now on the Leadership Council.
